On 16th February 2023, the Cabinet Secretary for Ministry of Youth Affairs, the Arts and Sports Hon. Ababu Namwamba presided over the opening of Teresa Oyiolo Library in Busia County. The facility was built for the community by the grand children of Teresa Oyiolo in her memory.

This is a significant milestone for the KNLS as it aligns with the Board's mission of promoting library and information services to the Kenyan public. Dr. Charles Nzivo, who represented KNLS, donated 1000 new curriculum books to boost the new facility. He urged the local community and learners to utilize the library and the services available to enhance their scope of knowledge and academic performance.

The CS reiterated the importance of educating the community through library services, adding that the government is committed to ensuring that quality education is offered at the grass root level. He underscored that this was in line with the government's Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), which he termed as a key catalyst to education and uplifting of people's livelihood from the bottom.

The CS hoped that amidst the devolution of the public library service function to the County governments, KNLS would continue to offer technical support and link the libraries to digital space under the virtual library, once it is officially launched. Also present was area MP Hon. Raphael Wanjala, among others.

Karatina Library partners with Ajira Digital to train women on digital marketing skills



The Ajira Digital training programme was launched at Karatina library to equip women with digital marketing skills. The program, which is free of charge, provides participants with practical skills in social media marketing, digital marketing, social media management, search engine optimization, email marketing, and content creation. Through this program, participants acquire marketable skills that can help them secure online work opportunities or start their own digital marketing businesses. Additionally, the program aims to promote gender equality by providing women with equal access to digital education and employment opportunities. During the quarter under review, the training was conducted on 22nd February 2023 and Tuesday 23rd February 2023. A total of 32 benefited from the programme.

The initiative has received widespread support from the community, with many lauding the efforts of the KNLS and Ajira Digital in promoting digital skills among women. According to Catherine, one of the participants in the program remarked, "I never thought I could learn digital marketing skills, but thanks to this program, I am now able to market my products online and reach a wider market."

Training to promote Financial Literacy was sponsored by Equity Bank for over 50 small business owners comprising farmers, boda boda riders, and small eatery joint owners. The training which was facilitated by Mr. Daniel Kipkorir from the Mwachon Ajira Digital Center was conducted at the Eldama Ravine Library on Wednesday 22nd February 2023. The topics covered general good business practices including record keeping, business risks, insurance, and online business practices. The participants were also given insights on how to market their products and services online. They were however warned against mobile phone fraudsters that may jeopardize their businesses. The facilitator encouraged the participants to always visit Mwachon Ajira Centre for free in-depth training on online businesses and other ICT skills.

The Eldama Ravine Librarian, Mrs. Grace Locheria, urged participants to make good use of the library together with their other family members. Through this, they would be able to improve their knowledge and access diverse opportunities online, which could help to improve their living standards. The partnership with Equity Bank and Ajira Digital is expected to improve the residents' financial literacy in businesses and draw more people to use the library facility.

Promoting Literacy and Providing Access to Information for all members of our community, including Persons With Disabilities (PWD)

KNLS is committed to promoting literacy and providing access to information for all members of the public, including persons with disabilities (PWDs). In support of this commitment, KNLS Nairobi Area Library received a donation of 2 desktop computers loaded with PWD software and 2 Kibo reading packs on 12th January 2023 from Hope Tech Plus Limited. This is a company that develops assistive technology products for Visually Impaired Persons. The devices were handed over to KNLS by the company Director Mr. Brain Mwiti Mwenda.

To ensure maximum usage of the donated equipment, a total of 30 staff (17 from NAL, 3 from Digitization Lab, 2 from the Data Centre, 4 from ICT, 2 from CDBD, and 2 NLD) were trained on how to use the devices. The software can translate the content in many languages giving the VIP a chance to read whichever book they want in any language.

We appreciate that through collaboration and partnerships, we can achieve our goal of creating a society that is well-informed and empowered to tackle the challenges of the 21st century.

In recent years, there has been a growing demand for digital marketing skills in Kenya, with businesses and organizations seeking to leverage the power of the Internet to reach their target audience. KNLS efforts to promote digital skills are in line with the Board's broader goal of transforming the KNLS libraries into hubs of knowledge and innovation. As the world shifts towards a digital economy, it is crucial that individuals are equipped with the necessary skills to thrive in this new era. In this regard, KNLS collaborates with strategic partners such as Ajira Digital to offer this desired training to community members.

As part of this, Nairobi Area Library in partnership with Ajira Digital conducted a two day training on digital marketing and e-commerce for the youth on 15th and 16th of March 2023. The participants totaling to 87, comprised of Small Medium Entrepreneurs, form four leavers, members of Community Based Organizations and the general library clients. Nine (9) KNLS staff also benefited from the training. The key speakers involved graduates from JKUAT IT department, Mr. Charles and Mr. Peter Kuria.

“Books don’t belong only in fancy buildings, they belong in the hands of those who seek knowledge. KNLS is taking the lead in making this a reality by turning containers into libraries in all constituencies.

The Kenya National Library Service -KNLS in partnership with Nation Media Group, is set to launch an innovative project that will see the conversion of empty metal containers into libraries in all constituencies across the country. This move comes as a stop-gap measure to serve sub-counties and constituencies that are not currently served by national libraries.

According to the Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Charles Nzivo, the corporation will partner with primary and secondary schools to identify spaces where prefabricated containers will be placed. The containers will be fitted with shelves and other necessary equipment to serve the reading needs of both young and adult learners in rural areas.

The project aims to take libraries closer to Kenyans in a cost-effective manner, with the hope of making reading accessible to everyone regardless of their location. The converted containers will provide an ideal space for those who do not have access to libraries and will offer a variety of books for all age groups.

This initiative is a significant step towards promoting education and literacy in the country, especially in rural areas where access to books and learning materials is limited. By partnering with schools, KNLS hopes to encourage a culture of reading among young learners and promote lifelong learning among adults.

KNLS Donates 10,000 Books to Turkana County

KNLS donated 10,000 books to Turkana County in line with the Board's mandate of promoting a reading culture in Kenya. The donation was handed over to the Turkana County Executive for Education, Sports, and Social Protection, Ms. Leah Audan, and flagged off by Philomena Mwirigi, KNLS Deputy Director (Technical Services) in the company of other staff.

Turkana is one of the most remote regions in Kenya and has experienced a myriad of problems since independence. Further, KNLS Board has not been able to establish a library in this county. The County Government of Turkana has now established a library and this is expected to be a game-changer, especially in the education sector in the area. KNLS is glad to be associated with this milestone and looks forward to partnering with the County Government of Turkana to ensure the success of the library. Out of the 10,000 books donated, 8,000 were earmarked for the library while 2,000 were for distribution to needy schools within the County. The books, which covered various subjects, were sourced by KNLS from Book Aid International - UK, Spotlight Publishers, and Research Triangle Institute (RTI) International - Kenya.
