n 12th July 2023, we launched the virtual library dubbed vtabu which was officiated by the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Youth Affairs, the Arts and Sports, Hon. Ababu Namwamba. The launch of the virtual library, signifies a significant step forward in promoting knowledge-sharing and access to information. Spearheaded by the Kenya National Library Service (KNLS) and supported by various government entities, this innovative initiative is expected to revolutionize the way people in Kenya and beyond access and engage with information.

VTabu offers a diverse and extensive collection of resources, including over 200,000 digitized books, periodicals, research papers, government publications, and more. This vast platform of knowledge can be accessed from any internet-enabled device, making it convenient for users to explore and learn from various sources. The inclusion of downloadable e-books for offline reading addresses the issue of limited internet connectivity in some areas, making information more accessible to a wider audience. At the launch event held at Maktaba Kuu in Nairobi, Youth Affairs, the Arts and Sports, Cabinet Secretary Hon. Ababu Namwamba highlighted the importance of technology and innovation in promoting knowledge growth.

He expressed optimism that VTabu would not only enhance Kenya's global competitiveness but also contribute to economic growth by creating job opportunities related to content generation. The virtual library is expected to play a crucial role in supporting young learners through its Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC) materials, helping them identify and nurture their talents for future career opportunities.



One noteworthy aspect of vtabu is the Talanta Hela initiative, which aims to promote youth creativity and talents. This initiative provides a platform for young writers to monetize their literary works, encouraging the growth of creative industries in Kenya. The virtual library's information materials cater to learners of all ages and interests, covering a wide range of subjects such as children's content, general information e-books, fiction, non-fiction, journals, storybooks, cartoons, photography, wildlife, tourism, culture, science, information technology, and CBC education materials.

Access to the virtual library (vtabu) requires a nominal daily membership fee of Sh20, which offers flexible subscription options to accommodate various

preferences and needs. During the launch, President William Ruto's speech read by the CS declared July 12 as the annual national reading day. This underscores the government's commitment to fostering reading habits and utilizing the vtabu platform to facilitate personal and academic growth.

Dr. Charles Nzivo, the CEO of KNLS, extended an invitation to state agencies and organizations to utilize KNLS's data facility for cloud storage services and the KNLS Digitization Hub for digitizing important documents, pictures, and maps. The KNLS digital platform also provides on-demand digital skills training in areas such as coding, digital marketing, graphic design, and ICT skills, empowering young Kenyans to explore online job opportunities.

Kenya National Library Service Devolves 61 branches to County Governments



Kenya National Library Service (KNLS) has successfully devolved its operations to county governments, marking a significant transition in the management of library services. Josephat Rotich, Uasin Gishu County's Director of Human Resources, highlighted the benefits of this transfer, emphasizing that it will enhance the county governments' roles. Rotich, who received records and files of KNLS staff in Eldoret, noted that this move would particularly bolster the implementation of Information Communication Technology (ICT) initiatives and programs aimed at empowering the youth.

This transition was formally approved by the Inter-Governmental Technical Relations Committee (IGTRC) through a Kenya Gazette notice dated August 9, 2019. The IGTRC decision involved the delineation of KNLS functions and the distribution of libraries between the National and County Governments. Rotich praised the county's commitment

to ICT and youth empowerment under Governor Jonathan Bii's leadership, highlighting how KNLS's involvement will be instrumental in launching ICT incubation programs for the local youth.

As of July 1, 2023, 18 KNLS staff members have been transferred to the County, and the library service will now operate as a section within the Department of ICT and e-Government. Silah Rono, Acting Secretary for the County Public Service Board, affirmed that the board will efficiently integrate the transferred personnel into the county's employment systems, adhering to established structures. Martin Kuelekho, a representative from IGTRC, indicated that the committee is in the final stages of devolving functions to counties as stipulated by the constitution. Currently the library has three branches Nairobi, Maktaba Kuu Building, Buruburu and Nakuru.


