Empowering Youth with the Essential Digital Skills for the World of Work

KNLS in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and the Digital Opportunity Trust (DOT), and other partners, is making strides in spreading digital literacy in different parts of the country. The training focuses on equipping people with essential skills for success in the current digital era. This has been carried out through the KNLS branch networks as highlighted below:

1. Thika Library graduates 230 students with digital skills

Since 2018, KNLS Thika Branch has been providing basic computer skills training to the youth and other library clients, and to date over 1600 trainees have graduated.

On Friday, March 31st, 2023, a graduation ceremony was held at the Thika Library under the theme “An Empowered Generation,” to celebrate the success of 230 students who completed a three-months Computer Training Program under different cohorts. This program, which was facilitated by DOT and Ajira Digital, provided the trainees with valuable digital skills that are crucial for success in today’s economy.

The Computer Training Program covered a wide range of topics, including computer basics, internet and email usage, and software applications such as Microsoft Office. Through this program, graduates have gained practical skills that are highly in demand in the job market, enhancing their employability and potential for future success.

She highlighted the organization's efforts in combating gender-based violence and supporting girls' rights. She also noted that the program has resulted in improved moral values among the girls and promised that the status of girls will continue to be improved through collaborative efforts to achieve the organization's motto and vision. Ms Laikipian expressed optimism that handing over the program to KNLS Meru library would safeguard its sustainability.

In conclusion, the Uzury Empowerment Hub has made a significant impact on society, with girls who have undergone the training already starting their own businesses and improving their social well-being. The partnership between Uzury Empowerment and KNLS Meru is expected to further enhance the program's reach and sustainability, empowering more girls in Meru County and promoting gender equality.

A Reader at KNLS Nakuru Library narrates how she used the library to change lives

Rose Wanjiru, a 50-year-old widow and mother of six, has made a significant impact on her community through her journey with the KNLS in Nakuru County. Her determination to improve her son's education led her to the library in 2006, and since then, she has not only transformed her son's life but also the lives of other children in her neighborhood.

Rose, originally from Nyeri County, had limited resources after finishing secondary school in 1984. Despite her parents' inability to afford her college or polytechnic education, Rose ventured into the business of selling second-hand clothes, known as "mutumba," in Nakuru. She also got married in 1991, but her husband passed away after only six years, leaving her to raise their children on her own.

In 2006, Rose's youngest son, who was in class 4 at Lanet Primary School, was struggling with his studies and being mistreated by his teacher. Determined to help her son, Rose remembered that she had once visited the KNLS Nyeri library in her days in school. With the help of a friend, she located the KNLS Nakuru library and she enrolled her son as a member. From 2006 to 2010, Rose and her son regularly visited the library, and his academic performance improved significantly. He scored 340 marks in his Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) exams and joined Bauuni Secondary School in 2011. He continued to utilize the library since he was a day scholar and eventually scored a B+ in his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) exams in 2014. He is now in his second year pursuing Mechanical Engineering at Kenya Technical University.

Rose's commitment to the library did not stop with her own children. She also registered her neighbors' children at the library and even paid for their book loans with her own money. The children, Jonathan Githinji, Sarah Kamau, Esther Wachira, and Kelvin K. Wachira, regularly visit Rose's home to pick storybooks and textbooks that she gets for them from the library. These have made a significant impact on their academic performance, and Rose regularly checks in with their teachers to monitor their progress. She is proud to see the positive changes in these children's lives and is grateful for the opportunity to help them, just as she has been helped by the library.

Rose's dedication to her community has not gone unnoticed. Her selflessness and determination to improve the lives of children through access to education and resources have earned her recognition and respect in her neighbourhood. She is an inspiration to others and serves as an example of how libraries can transform lives beyond just being a repository of books.

When asked about her motivation, Rose credits her faith in God and her belief in the power of education. She encourages others to take advantage of the resources and opportunities available at the library, as it can be a stepping stone towards a brighter future. Her story is a testament about the impact that libraries can have on individuals and communities, and Rose continues to be a beacon of hope for those seeking knowledge and empowerment.
