
### Chinese Officials donate shelves for the Chinese Corner at KNLS Makataba Kuu

KNLS values collaborations and fruitful cultural exchanges that will benefit the local community and foster a global goodwill.




# Jerusha Kananu Marete, an esteemed Kenyan writer and a recognized authority in the realm of theatre pays a courtesy visit to KNLS
